- The University of Idaho invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at an assistant or associate Professor level with an emphasis in Fuel Cycle Research.
- The successful candidate will demonstrate a strong commitment to research and teaching in the nuclear energy field.
- The emphasis is on the nuclear fuel cycle including aqueous and electrometallurgical reprocessing; radiochemistry; materials; and waste management and disposition. However, all aspects of nuclear energy will be considered including thermal hydraulics, modeling and simulation and advanced reactors.
